Minimum requirements for acceptance to the UALC:

9 th and 10 th grade applicants = no credit requirement, minimum behavior issues
11 th grade applicants = 7 credits (start of Semester I), 10 credits (start of Semester II)
12 th grade applicants = 13 credits (start of Semester I), 16 credits (start of Semester II
All 5th year high school students will be accepted into the afternoon session.
